Bus routes can be found on our website. The late bus schedule is shared daily in the morning announcements. Late bus routes go to central locations for each city/town. Students have access to the late bus for athletics, extra help sessions, and school-sponsored events ONLY.

Welcome Class of 2029

We look forward to meeting you and helping you navigate through your first year of high school! We want you to know that we are here to help and guide you through all of the ins and outs of your new school and look forward to the start of the new school year.

Orientation will be held on August 20th and August 21st from 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. Students with last names starting **A-J** will attend orientation on **August 20th** and those with last names starting **K-Z** will attend on **August 21st**. At orientation, you will be issued your chromebooks, get your Monty Tech email, and learn about the wonderful opportunities that we have.

Your first week of school will be an academic week - 'A week'. Schedules will be given to you at orientation. You might have questions and we will be sure to answer them when we meet. Here are a few common ones that we hope help prepare you for your first days of school:

What school supplies do I need for the first day of school?

We recommend that you have a backpack, your fully charged chromebook, a notebook and writing utensils for the first day. Each teacher will let you know what materials are required for their class so wait until you meet with them before you go and buy school supplies.

What do I wear?

To start, jeans, t-shirt and sneakers are perfect for both academic and shop weeks. We also recommend that you have a sweater or sweatshirt because some classrooms and shops can get cold, at times.

How do I get a MT Identification card (ID)?

At orientation we will take your ID picture. You will be issued your ID and lanyard on the first day of school. School ID's are expected to be worn everyday!

What about lunch?

You can either bring your own or pick up a lunch option in the cafeteria. Menus are generally posted monthly on our web page. Information on how to set up an online account through MySchoolBucks will be sent to your parent/guardian in the welcome packet mailed out in August.

Where do I find my bus schedule?

Bus schedules should be posted by mid August so check out our home page at www.montytech.net to see what bus you should be on.

What do I do if my student has a disability or requires additional support?

The district has reached out to middle schools for current records. If you are not sure we have received the plan or if you would like to discuss the referral process please contact your student's school counselor.

Please email if you have any questions or concerns as we are only in the building a few days during the summer. We want to make this transition as smooth as possible! Save the dates for Freshmen Orientation on August 20th or 21st! We are excited to meet you!

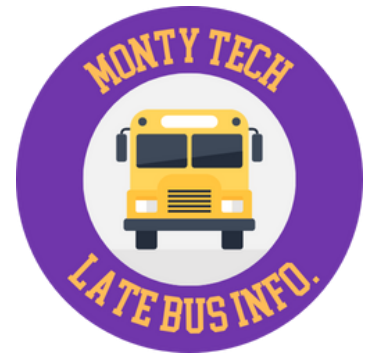

Bus Stops: Helpful Information!

Welcome All! Please find helpful information regarding bus transportation at Monty Tech.

1. As stated in the Massachusetts General Law: Bus Stops can be up to 1 MILE away from the student's residence. Monty Tech makes every effort to make bus stops that are as close and safe as possible, while still delivering students in a timely manner. This means we **DO NOT** make individualized stops at every household that a bus travels by.

Per Massachusetts general law. Chapter 71 - Section 68, any bus stop is not to be more than one mile from a student's residence.

2. Monty Tech does **NOT** make changes to the bus routes during the first few weeks of school. We do this in an effort for the bus companies to get a feel for what is working, and decide on adjustments they need to make.
3. Bus Stops are **NOT** changed because of their **stop time**. Due to the amount of towns our District covers, certain areas begin their routes earlier in an effort to arrive to school in a timely manner. Stop times will not be changed.
4. All students are assigned to **ONE** bus **ONE** stop. Any student who spends their time in different households or requires a different stop will **NEED** to request a bus pass.
5. All Bus Pass inquiries should be made at the **Dean's Office**.
PERMANENT BUS PASS: will allow student to use throughout the school year as needed without the need of a permission slip every time.
DAILY PASS: Single day use.



Please remember this is all for safety precautions!

6. Please share address changes with Student Support Services at your earliest convenience. Bus Stops cannot be made overnight.
7. MISSING ITEMS on a bus: We encourage students/families to contact the bus company to let them know sooner rather than later. Phone Number(s) can be found in our school website.

8. Any student that lives OUTSIDE of DISTRICT will NOT have an assigned bus/stop. **Ex. Leominster**
9. Monty Tech **only posts AM stop times**, please note bus routes run the opposite way in the afternoon. Meaning the last stop in the morning would most likely be first in the afternoon. Each student/family is responsible for checking bus routes before school starts. We ask all students to be at their stop 10 minutes early.



We understand your student is experiencing many changes right now, and we want to be as supportive as we possibly can during this time. Please remember our Drivers and staff are trying their very best to attend to the needs of all our students, equally!

CLASSES

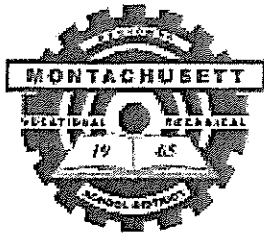

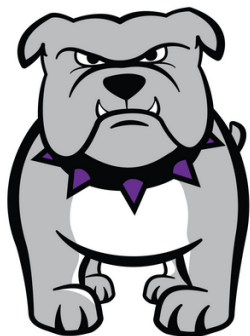
