## Welcome Class of 2025!!

We look forward to finally meeting you and helping you navigate through your first year of high school.

We want you to know that we are here to help and guide you through all of the ins and outs of your new school and look forward to welcoming you next school year.

Orientation will be held on August 17th or 18th. You will be assigned a time slot based on your homeroom once schedules are completed. At orientation you will be issued your chromebooks, get your Monty Tech email, and learn more about the wonderful opportunities that we have to offer you starting your freshman year.

Your first week of school will be an academic week - 'A week'. Schedules will be given to you at orientation. You might have questions and we will be sure to answer them when we meet. Here are a few common ones that we hope help prepare you for your first days of school:

### **What school supplies do I need?**

We recommend that you have a good backpack, your fully charged chromebook, a notebook and writing utensils for the first day. Each teacher will let you know what materials are required for their class so wait until you meet with them before you go and buy school supplies.

### **What do I wear?**

To start, jeans, t-shirt and sneakers are perfect for both weeks. We also recommend that you have a sweater or sweatshirt because some classrooms and shops can get cold at times. The CDC has not yet changed regulations for school. You will need to plan to wear a mask every day even on the bus. We will send updates when the CDC makes changes to the regulations.

### **How do I get a MT Identification card (ID)?**

At orientation will take your ID picture. You will be issued your ID and lanyard on the first day of school. School ID's are expected to be worn everyday!

### **What about lunch?**

You can either bring your own or pick up a lunch option in the cafeteria. Menus are generally posted monthly on our web page. Information on how to set up an online account through MySchoolBucks will be sent to your parent/guardian in the welcome packet mailed out in August.

### **Where do I find my bus schedule?**

Bus schedules should be posted by mid August so check out our home page at [www.montytech.net](http://www.montytech.net) to see what bus you should be on.

Once you know your schedule, please don't be afraid to reach out to your teachers if you have questions about their requirements or assigned work. Communicating with your teachers not only helps you but it also helps them to know when you are struggling.

Since freshmen start out in academic classes the first week of school, the following week will be your Pre-Exploratory program. These shop days are when you will be rotating through all 21 shops to get an idea of what each area is like before you have to choose your top 12.

**Please bring your fully charged chromebook everyday you are in academics, and check your Exploratory Requirement sheet to see which shops will require you to use it for exploratory. DO NOT bring your chromebook during Pre-Exploratory.**

Please email us if you have any questions or concerns. We want to make this transition is as smooth as possible. Let us know if there is anything that you are unsure about or need clarification on.

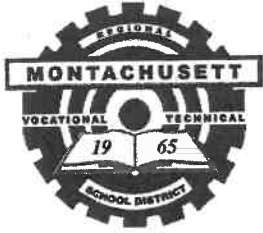


# Welcome Incoming Freshmen

All incoming students will be receiving a school issued Chromebook at the beginning of the school year as part of Monty Tech's 1:1 Chromebook Program.



- Chromebooks will be distributed to incoming freshmen, and all newly enrolled students within the first three weeks of the school year.
- Optional insurance will be offered for the Chromebooks for parents to purchase.
- Parents/Guardians and students are required to sign and return the Chromebook Agreement Form, and the Acceptable Use Policy.
- Technology will be used in your classes, and you will be required to bring your Chromebook to class every day fully charged. Teachers will be using Google Classroom and other tools in class.
- Monty Tech's filtering software will be in place on the device during school and outside of school. It blocks websites that are inappropriate for students.
- You will be able to personalize your Chromebook by purchasing an optional case. You may put stickers and markings on your purchased case, because it is your case. But NO stickers on the device itself are allowed. All items must be appropriate and not violate any school policy or rule. Recommended cases will be available for purchase in the school store.
- Stickers and markings on the outside of the actual Chromebook will not be allowed.
- There will be a presentation about digital citizenship and appropriate social media usage for all students to attend at the beginning of the school year. It will cover topics such as:
  - \* Common Sense on Social Networks
  - \* How to Present Yourself Online
  - \* Ways to Protect Yourself Online
  - \* Internet Safety, Using the Internet Responsibly
  - \* Cyberbullying and more...
- Devices that are lost, stolen, or vandalized need to be reported to the school's Deans' office immediately, and students will be required to submit a report.
- Technical support will be available through the Technology Department. Do not attempt to repair the device yourself.

**Student Responsibilities** - Your Chromebook is an important learning tool and is for educational purposes. In order to take your Chromebook home each day, you and your parents/guardians must be willing to accept the following responsibilities:

- I/we understand that the Chromebook is my responsibility.
- I/we understand that Chromebook use is a privilege not a right.
- I/we will not leave my Chromebook unsupervised and will do everything I can to prevent it from damage.
- I/we will honor the Montachusett Regional Vocational Technical School Chromebook Guidelines and the Acceptable Use Policy.
- I/we will not view, create, send, or download inappropriate material.
- I/we will bring the Chromebook to school every day with a fully charged battery.
- I/we will treat the Chromebook as a valuable piece of equipment and will report any mechanical or technical issues to a teacher immediately.
- I/we will not attempt to add, delete, access, or modify other user accounts on the Chromebook.
- I/we will take no action that could interfere with the Montachusett Regional Vocational Technical School network.
- I/we will report inappropriate use to my instructor or an administrator.
- I/we will return the Chromebook when requested by the Technology Department or upon withdrawing from the school.
- I/we will file a police report in case of theft or damage caused by fire and notify the Dean's Office immediately.
- I/we agree to pay the full replacement cost of my Chromebook and/or power cord/charger in the event either of these items are lost or damaged through my own negligence.
- I/we understand that we have the opportunity to purchase Chromebook Accident and Theft Coverage through an partner insurer. The plan costs \$19.50 annually. While not mandatory, the District recommends that parents purchase this coverage to protect against more substantial losses.

**I/we agree to the terms above and accept responsibility for the Montachusett Regional Vocational Technical School-owned Chromebook. I understand that I am accepting responsibility and am responsible for the total cost of any damage, destruction, or loss of the assigned Chromebook due to my negligence. I understand that I am responsible for the total cost of replacing a damaged, destroyed, or lost Chromebook any time after the first full replacement cost is incurred by the school.**

# MARINE CORPS JUNIOR RESERVE OFFICER TRAINING CORPS



**PURPOSE:** The purpose of the Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (MCJROTC) program is to:

- Teach leadership values and principles.
- Promote an understanding of civic responsibilities.
- Support service to community and Country.
- Instill a sense of personal responsibility and accomplishment.

## **THREE MAJOR OBJECTIVES:**

1. Give students an appreciation for the origin, advantages and responsibilities of leadership.
2. Develop an understanding of leadership skills and the advantages of a strong moral character.
3. Develop in students a sense of pride, discipline and personal responsibility.

We are not seeking to recruit for the military and MCJROTC does not obligate students to serve in the armed forces. We strive to meet Monty Tech's mission:

*"Every student will graduate with the skills , knowledge and abilities to be a productive member of an ever-changing society."*



**UNIFORMS** are required for wear in the MCJROTC one day per week. This is a mandatory requirement. Uniforms are provided at no cost to the student for participating in the MCJROTC program.



**PHYSICAL FITNESS TRAINING** is conducted one day per week along with the completion of the Youth Physical Fitness Test (YPFT) two times during the school year. Promoting good physical health is a core concept of leadership education.



**CLASSES** evolve around leadership education. MCJROTC is progressive with students moving from one school year to the next. Upon entering the program, students will be referred to (and to each other) as cadets. Freshman cadets will begin as a Leadership Education One (LE I) and make their way through LE II (Sophomore), LE III (Junior), and LE IV during Senior year. Each year builds on the previous year with additional knowledge and responsibilities.

**PROMOTIONS** occur through demonstrated potential along with consistent adherence to all MCJROTC rules and regulations. Some students will have the potential to progress through rank at an accelerated pace through routine demonstration of above average performance. Promotions are never given; they are always earned.

**OPPORTUNITY** in the MCJROTC Leadership program will allow students to be more confident and better prepared for their futures, no matter what direction they pursue in the trades, college, or military service.
