











- How will MVP operate on a day-to-day basis?
 - MVP classes will begin on the week of Sept. 9th (more information coming)
 - A week Seniors at MVP / Juniors at FHS/GHS/NRHS for academics
 - B week Juniors at MVP / Seniors at FHS/GHS/NRHS for academics
 - Students in the MVP Program will follow the Monty Tech school calendar
- How will the day start?
 - MVP students will take Monty Tech buses to Monty Tech Bus stops by Friday
 - Drivers will park in a specific area of the parking lot and must have a MVP parking tag visible in their car. Drivers must arrive to campus by 7:30am








- MVP students can access breakfast at Monty Tech using their ID.
- All MVP students will be driven to the MVP Program at 7:40am
- While enrolled at MVP Academy, most records will be kept at their sending school.
 - Each day, the students' attendance will be sent from MVP to the sending school
 - Parents/Guardians should call the sending school if your student is going to be absent.
 - Also, attendance documentation should be sent to the sending school.
 - Term grades will be sent, quarterly, to the sending districts and be included on that report card



- Similarly, discipline issues will be reported to the proper administrator from the sending district and consequences will be based on your home district handbooks.
- Two important policies -
 - <u>Dress Code</u> All students will receive a MVP Academy shirt.
 Loose jewelry cannot be worn
- <u>Electronic Devices</u> only with the explicit approval of instructors <u>Please review the remainder of the Student Handbook before the</u> <u>school year begins. You and your parents/guardians will be asked to</u> <u>sign-off an acknowledgment that you have read the Handbook</u> completely.



How is my student's IEP or 504 Plan addressed at MVP Academy?

- IEP/504 Plans are established and assessed by the sending
- districts Special Education/504 Team.
- Information regarding the IEP/504 will be shared with
- MVP instructors and classroom assistants.
- Any questions or concerns about how modifications are being applied
- to vocational instruction should go through the sending district's office.
- Any modifications to an IEP/504 or special services are determined and addressed by the sending district.





What might a typical day at MVP Academy look like?

- Arrive at Monty Tech by 7:35, get breakfast and take bus to 270 Westminster St. at 7:40.
- Course instruction throughout the morning including classroom lessons (Related Theory).
- Lunches at 11:00 and 11:30. Pre-ordered and delivered to 270 Westminster.
- (Note if needed, the school nurse will visit to address any medication needs.)
- Instruction continues through afternoon until clean up at 2:20pm.
- MVP Students take bus to main campus to get on buses or personal cars. Participation in afterschool activities determined by sending district.

How might this change at the beginning of the year?

- Arrival to Monty Tech stays the same. However, after breakfast, Electrical students will go to the Electrical shop and Carpentry students will go to the pavilion and outdoor classroom.
- Lunch will be held during the Culinary Lunch in the cafeteria at 10:09am.
- MVP students should refrain from wandering the halls, especially in the academic areas.
