• FY22 has presented more opportunities for competitive grants than ever before. With a record-breaking \$1.7M submitted in proposals, we remain grateful for the continued support we receive from programs such as Skills Capital and MLSC.

We are awaiting word on 3 grants still under review, totaling: \$1,108,704.

NOTE: On average, over the past ten years, we have received approximately \$390,000 a year in competitive grants.

- Open House 2022 Thursday, March 10th we opened our doors to the community, and hosted an extremely well-attended Open House event. All vocational shops proudly displayed student work. Student translators were on hand. Athletic programs had student-athletes available to answer questions and share experiences with prospective students, and student clubs were also on hand to share ways all students can get involved here at Monty Tech.
- Co-Op Program There are currently 49 Juniors and 131 Seniors participating in the school's popular Co-Op program. Students are working and learning in area businesses, earning \$13 \$25/hr. We are pleased to report new school-to-business partnerships with 37 new employers supporting our students.

- Annual Open House March 10
 - For the first time in three years, Monty Tech was able to welcome hundreds of prospective students, their families and numerous guests back to the building as part of our annual Open House.
 - For the first time, in order to support families who had very little understanding of Monty Tech, we opened the evening with a presentation from the Dean of Admissions in the PAC for the purposes of introducing the essentials in terms of student expectations, the exploratory

- process and what supports and extracurricular opportunities are available to students. Due to the overwhelming turnout, this will become a fixture for Open House events in the future.
- An additional change was that, rather than spreading them out around the building, we gathered all academic departments in the cafeteria so that parents and students could get "one-stop-shopping" and learn about course offerings all at the same time.
- Two student volunteers who served as translators for our Spanish-speaking guests throughout the evening.
- Student athletes and coaches were stationed in the main gym to answer questions regarding our athletic teams and expectations.
- ½ Professional Development Day March 11
 - For the final Professional Development Day of the year, once again, teachers were provided with a variety of offerings.
- SkillsUSA District Competitions March 16
 - Overall, Monty Tech earned 27 medals 14 Gold, 6 Silver and 7 Bronze.

- ELA Next Generation MCAS Administration March 22-23
 - Prior to the MCAS administration, teachers recommended specific students to participate in a specific review program. The ELA MCAS review consisted of MCAS Review Information, Analysis Writing Review, Multiple Choice Review, Multiple Choice Review, RAFT & Persuasive Writing Review, and Figurative Language and Literary Terms Quiz.
 - Our goal is to help reinforce the critical concepts these students need to know to pass the MCAS test.
 - On the testing days, 352 Sophomores participated in the MCAS exam for English Language Arts. All Academic, Special Education, Paraprofessional, and Guidance staff went through proctor training sessions to become familiar with the test administration process, as well as the specific online tools that are available to students during the test.
