2. Superintendent-Director's Report Information: A. Superintendent-Director Update

- As of December, all the Health Occupations seniors who took the Certified Clinical Medical Assistant Exam passed.
- Update on 270 Westminster Street Superintendent Browne reported that Monty Tech has come to a lease agreement with 270 Westminster Street LLC with the following highlights:
 - Base Lease Rate \$11.00/square foot
 - Base Rent Escalator
 - 5% for initial five year term
 - 4% for each subsequent term
- Initial 5 year term
 - Starting date: February 1, 2023
 - Ending date: July 31, 2028
 - Monty Tech will seek a property tax abatement from the City of Fitchburg
 - Monty Tech will be submitting an After Dark Approval Application by 3/10/2023
- DESE Admissions Response Letter Monty Tech submitted a response to DESE's December 7, 2022 inquiry regarding admissions practices.
 - Monty Tech Administrators have met several times with DESE Representatives, virtually and in-person, in order to discuss admissions-related data. DESE confirmed during a November 17, 2022 ZOOM meeting that they would assess and review data from the full district as opposed to individual communities.
- Monty Tech reminded DESE about the recent changes that were implemented this year to admission scores including:
 - Expanding the score range of academic grades
 - Expanding the score range of allowable unexcused absences
 - Revised the scoring rubric for Discipline/Conduct Rating, removing all reference to minor incidents/infractions, only including out-of-school Chap. 37H¹/₂ suspensions.
 - Removed the cutoff score so that all students, no matter their application's cumulative score, would be considered acceptable candidates.
- Monty Tech further shared changes to our admission practices;
 - Expanded targeted outreach efforts, to include visits to ESL and Special Education classrooms
 - Student translators (current and former ELL students) were available at recruiting events in local middle schools
 - Marketing materials were newly updated and translated
 - Student translators were made available at summer camps and after-school V.I.P. (Vocational Interest Programs)
 - Faculty/staff translators were available at the annual Tour Day event
 - Monty Tech was one of only 8 regional vocational districts who hired a Community Outreach Specialist
 - The Dean of Admissions attended training in bias, equity and access
 - Data review and analysis is a common practice among school administrators

Committee members affirmed that the letter submitted to DESE on December 21, 2022 accurately represented the position of the committee and approved district policies.
