We look forward to meeting you and helping you navigate through your first year of high school!We want you to know that we are here to help and guide you through all of the ins and outs of your new school and look forward to the start of the new school year.

Orientation will be held on August 16th or 17th. You will be assigned a time slot based on your homeroom once schedules are completed. At orientation, you will be issued your chromebooks, get your Monty Tech email, and learn more about the wonderful opportunities that we have to offer you starting your freshman year.

Your first week of school will be an academic week - 'A week'. Schedules will be given to you at orientation. You might have questions and we will be sure to answer them when we meet. Here are a few common ones that we hope help prepare you for your first days of school:

What school supplies do I need for the first day of school?

We recommend that you have a backpack, your fully charged chromebook, a notebook and writing utensils for the first day. Each teacher will let you know what materials are required for their class so wait until you meet with them before you go and buy school supplies.

What do I wear?

To start, jeans, t-shirt and sneakers are perfect for both academic and shop weeks. We also recommend that you have a sweater or sweatshirt because some classrooms and shops can get cold at times.

How do I get a MT Identification card (ID)?

At orientation we will take your ID picture. You will be issued your ID and lanyard on the first day of school. School ID's are expected to be worn everyday!

What about lunch?

You can either bring your own or pick up a lunch option in the cafeteria. Menus are generally posted monthly on our web page. Information on how to set up an online account through MySchoolBucks will be sent to your parent/guardian in the welcome packet mailed out in August.

Where do I find my bus schedule?

What do I do if my student has a disability or requires additional support?

How are students placed in shops at Monty Tech?



Freshmen Pre-Exploratory and Exploratory Process

During the first vocational week, all incoming freshmen rotate through a pre-exploratory program that consists of two periods in each vocational area. At the conclusion of the week, students select twelve vocational areas they would like to explore during the first semester. Students will then be placed in a nine-week rotation exploring nine of their twelve choices - students are guaranteed to explore their top three choices.

After completing the nine-week rotation and discussing their options with their parent/guardian, all freshmen will select their top six choices for their final vocational placement. At the end of the exploratory period, all students will be placed in a vocational area based on:

- student's ranking of the vocational areas (1-6 where 1 is their most desired shop)
- the grade the student received during his/her exploratory for that shop's week
- space availability

Students are graded on conduct, effort, cooperation, willingness to follow instructions, follow through on assigned tasks, daily attendance, and personal safety/care of equipment.

A student must receive a vocational assessment grade of 60 or higher in a shop in order to select it as one of their top 6 choices.

It is important that students work to the best of their abilities in ALL exploratories as scores received in other exploratories may be used in the case of a tie for a shop space.

The Guidance Department will make every effort to place the student in one of their six choices. In cases where students are unable to be placed in one of their top choices, the guidance counselor will meet with the student individually and contact the parent/guardian to discuss next steps.

Additional information will be provided, as the students get ready to make their final selections.











SUMMER 2022

All incoming freshman are **REQUIRED** to complete a math packet, read one novel, and complete a short essay prompt.

Students are REQUIRED to submit their work to their English and math teachers on the first day of school.

Cadets will wear the Marine Corps JROTC uniform one day per week. Uniforms are provided at no cost to the student for participation in the program.

PHYSICAL FITNESS

Physical fitness training is conducted one day per week along with completion of a strengthassessment two times during the school year.

CLASSES

Classes will evolve around Leadership Education. The program is progressive with cadets moving from one school year to the next. Welcome Incoming Freshmen

All incoming students will be receiving a school issued Chromebook at the beginning of the school year as part of Monty Tech's 1:1 Chromebook Program.



- Chromebooks will be distributed to incoming freshmen, and all newly enrolled students within the first three weeks of the school year.
- Optional insurance will be offered for the Chromebooks for parents to purchase.
- Parents/Guardians and students are required to sign and return the Chromebook Agreement Form, and the Acceptable Use Policy.
- Technology will be used in your classes, and you will be required to bring your Chromebook to class every day fully charged. Teachers will be using Google Classroom and other tools in class.
- Monty Tech's filtering software will be in place on the device during school and outside of school. It blocks websites that are inappropriate for students.
- You will be able to personalize your Chromebook by purchasing an optional case. You may put stickers and markings on your purchased case, because it is your case. But NO stickers on the device itself are allowed. All items must be appropriate and not violate any school policy or rule. Recommended cases will be available for purchase in the school store.
- Stickers and markings on the outside of the actual Chromebook will not be allowed.
- There will be a presentation about digital citizenship and appropriate social media usage for all students to attend at the beginning of the school year. It will cover topics such as:
 - * Common Sense on Social Networks
 - * How to Present Yourself Online
 - * Ways to Protect Yourself Online
 - * Internet Safety, Using the Internet Responsibly
 - * Cyberbullying and more...
- Devices that are lost, stolen, or vandalized need to be reported to the school's Deans' office immediately, and students will be required to submit a report.
- Technical support will be available through the Technology Department. Do not attempt to repair the device yourself.

Student Responsibilities - Your Chromebook is an important learning tool and is for educational purposes. In order to take your Chromebook home each day, you and your parents/guardians must be willing to accept the following responsibilities:

- I/we understand that the Chromebook is my responsibility.
- I/we understand that Chromebook use is a privilege not a right.
- I/we will not leave my Chromebook unsupervised and will do everything I can to prevent it from damage.
- I/we will honor the Montachusett Regional Vocational Technical School Chromebook Guidelines and the Acceptable Use Policy.
- I/we will not view, create, send, or download inappropriate material.
- I/we will bring the Chromebook to school every day with a fully charged battery.
- I/we will treat the Chromebook as a valuable piece of equipment and will report any mechanical or technical issues to a teacher immediately.
- I/we will not attempt to add, delete, access, or modify other user accounts on the Chromebook.
- I/we will take no action that could interfere with the Montachusett Regional Vocational Technical School network.
- I/we will report inappropriate use to my instructor or an administrator.
- I/we will return the Chromebook when requested by the Technology Department or upon withdrawing from the school.
- I/we will file a police report in case of theft or damage caused by fire and notify the Dean's Office immediately.
